

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What is Lotus+?

- Erasmus Mundus Action 2 project running from 2014-2018
 - Continuation of Lotus 1 4 (coordinated by Ghent)
 - Consortium of 20 partners from EU/Asia
- Scholarships for Asian/EU students and researchers to go on exchanges/degree studies
 - Coordinated by Uppsala University (Sweden)
 - Joint coordinated by Sichuan University (China)
 - Funded by the European Commission







What are the aims of Lotus+?

Lotus+ aims to link Asia and Europe together through cooperation between universities, and thereby create synergies.

- Establish a pool of well-educated, open-minded future leaders with international experience
- Make it possible for gifted students from vulnerable groups to study abroad and thereby disseminating EU social and democratic values
- Create Alumni tools, signing bilateral agreements, creating joint programmes
- Enhance the skills of staff, who can in their turn contribute to the improvement of the education system in their home country
- Disseminate Best Practices in creating a joint policy on recognition of studies abroad and credit transfer
- Enhance the political, cultural, educational and economic links between the EU and the Asian countries involved

What scholarships are available?

198 scholarships 48 EU-> Asia 150 Asia -> EU

- Bachelor and master exchanges (1-2 semesters)
- Master degrees (1-2 years) (only Asian candidates)
 - PhD and Post-doc exchanges (6-10 months)
 - PhD degrees (3 years) (only Asian candidates)
- Staff exchanges (administrative/academic) (1 month)







What is included in the scholarship?

- 1000-2500 euros /month
 - Flight tickets
 - Visa costs
 - Health insurance
- Tuition fee (at the host university)

LOTUS+ Partnership

- Involves all full partners
- Discusses visibility, management, communication, quality assurance, sustainability, recognition issues etc.
- Has the decision making power
- Sets and supervises the goals of the project (in meetings and/or via email)







Coordinating institution (UU)

- Coordination of consortium actions
- Compliance with submitted proposal
- Production of documentation necessary for project/grantholders
- Database & Website
- Communication with EACEA
- Communication with other stakeholders
- Communication with applicants & grantholders
- Financial management of the project
- Monitoring of the project based on feedback from LOTUS+ partnership
- Produces visibility & marketing strategy
- Organizes meetings & events
- Chairs Selection committee







Joint Coordinating institution (Sichuan University)

- Defines (together with UU) strategies and proposals to present to Lotus+ Partnership
- Official representative of the project towards authorities in the region, such as the EC delegations, Ministries of Education, embassies
- Represent the Asian partners in meetings
- Intervene in cases of visa problems
- Informing other partners of best practices especially in regards to EU->Asia mobility
- Chairs Regional Working Group
- Co-chair of Selection Committee







EU/Asian partners

- Dissemination of the project & scholarships
- Reporting to the coordinating institution
- Handles local finance/administrative issues
- Pays scholarships (only EU)
- Arranges information sessions & offers support to applicants
- Helps grantholders fulfil their obligation towards the project (monitoring)
- Helps with issues regarding recognition of studies/diploma
- Validates/evaluates applications
- Fosters collaboration between partners (co-tutelles, bilateral agreements etc.)







Selection committee

- Involves Coordinator and Joint Coordinator plus two Asian and two EU partners
- Final proposal of the selection
- Replacements in case of drop outs
- Makes recommendations to the LOTUS+ partnerships in case of selection issues







Regional Asian Working Group

- Meet once a year during the project life cycle
- Discuss issues specifically for Asian partners
- Present problems & solutions to the coordinator and the LOTUS+ partnership
- 1 representative from each Asian country







Associates

- Dissemination of scholarship opportunities
- Validation of TG3 candidates
- Disseminate impact of project

1. Organization (210.000 €)

2. Scholarships (2.017.700 €)

- Transferred from UU to host university (only EU hosts)
- For EU->Asia mobility EU-partners/coordinator pays
- Paid on monthly basis (exception first payment = double payment)








3. Travel (431.500 €)

- Tickets bought centrally via UU travel agency (American Express)
- Based on dates reported in database
- Return ticket (two one way tickets for mobilities over 10 months)
- Budget for ticket based on distance host/home
- Also covers visa costs and travel from airport to host university
- In some cases travel to airport in home country
- To what extent should we allow grantees to come to/stay in EU/Asia before/after academic periods?









4. Insurance (120.225 €)

- Insurance bought centrally by UU
- Swedish government agency Kammarkollegiet
- According to minimum requirements by EACEA
- Valid from when the grantee leaves his/her home until return
- Valid in all EU countries (regardless of study destination)
- Valid in all partner countries (regardless of study destination)
- For small costs (check ups etc.) grantee pays then reimbursed
- Larger costs insurance company deals directly with hospital









5. Participation costs (270.000 €)

- 3000 € per 10 months (post-doc excluded)
- Calculated from start and end dates of academic activity
- Host universities are responsible to check dates
- Mobilities <10 months = fee waiver by host
- PC is transferred from UU to host uni

What counts as 10 months? 9 months and 16 days = 3000 € 9 months and 15 days = 0 €

Participation costs (PC)

10 months = 3000 € 18-26 months = 6000 € 27 – 34 months= 9000 €

What to do with PC?

- Tuition fee
- lab costs
- Conferences
- language courses (should always be free for the grantee!)







Some sound financial advice...

- Save all receipts, boarding passes, invoices etc.
- Keep a record of all expenses
- Upload requested documentation into the database
- Detailed budgets, reports etc will be available in the database

All originals must be kept until July 2023!







Consortium Agreement Draft version finalized by Uppsala – will be circulated to all partners during November

- 1 cohort is planned
- Deadline march 1st
- Quick validations & evaluations = everyone starts on time
 - Check your academic offers!

- At least 50 % of the mobility must be from the partner universities
- At least 30 % of the mobility must be from Cambodia, Myanmar & Vietnam
- Requirement per academic level: 20-40% BA, 15-35% MA, 10-30% PhD, 5-20% Post-doc, 15-35% staff
- Mobility scheme is indicative Selection Committee can shift mobilities based on evaluations and number of applications

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Implementation of mobility – preparations

Home University

- Help with courses/study programme/ research programme/activity plan
- Does the applicant need extra language support?
- Pre departure meeting (mandatory!)
- Clarify doubts about recognition
- A few words about cultural differences..

Host University

- Help with courses/study programme/ research programme/activity plan
- Invitation letter
- Information/welcome package
- Set mobility dates
- Housing
- Support for visa/residence permit







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Implementation of mobility – during the mobility

Home University

- Keep in touch with "your" grantee
- Stay alert to any changes to the mobility and react to them
- Inform grantee what documents (and in what format) he/she needs to get studies recognized
- Visit them and watch them "in action"!

Host University

- Welcome ceremonies
- Practical support
- Cultural & social programmes
- International buddies/guides
- Language course (should be free!)
- Monitoring meetings
- Check on academic achievements
- Social issues?

Implementation of mobility – after the mobility

Home University

- Help the recognition process
- Take advantage of grantees experience "internationalization at home"
- Use grantee as for example speaker and during information sessions

Host University


- Provide necessary documentation to grantee & home university
